At the SMDM Meeting in October, CHOICE PhD Alum, **Boshen Jiao**, **PhD ('22)** was awarded the Milt Weinstein Award for Outstanding Presentation in Applied Health Economics for his dissertation research on Associating Health-Related Quality of Life with Time Use to Capture Productivity Impacts in Economic Evaluation. # Fall Quarter at The CHOICE Institute

- The UW ICER modeling team (PI: Professor Josh Carlson, lead modeler: Kangho Suh, PhD '19, UPITT subcontractor and alumni) presented the findings from their review of drugs to treat ALS in August. <u>Read the report.</u>
- Associate Professor Jennifer Bacci received grants from UCB Pharma to support the "Community Pharmacist Epilepsy Services Program" pilot study and from HRSA through the UW Center for Health Workforce Studies to support the "Envisioning New Career Pathways for Pharmacy Technicians" study. Dr. Bacci was also elected to serve as the 2022-2023 Chair of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy (ACCP) Community-Based Practice and Research Network (PRN).
- The University of Washington ISPOR chapter held student board elections for the first time this year! Our student board for the 2022-23 school year will consist of **Tori Dayer** (President), **Ben Nwogu** (Vice President), **Ron Dickerson** (Treasurer), and Elizabeth Carnesi (Secretary). They organized a Social Fall Walk in the Park at the UW Arboretum in the first week of school, and then a collaborative Halloween social with the UW AMCP chapter. The new student board is looking forward to continuing their alumni seminar series on career paths this year, in addition to a few collaborative

events with other ISPOR student chapters.

- Third year PhD Student, Rachel Wittenauer, along with her collaborators Drs. Jennifer Bacci, Parth Shah, and Andy Stergachis, published an exploratory study on pharmacy deserts in Washington State, and they look forward to building on this during Rachel's dissertation research this academic year. In her research assistant role in the Department of Global Health, her team contributed to a technical brief for WHO regarding the use of HIV self-testing to initiate use of oral PrEP for HIV prevention. Lastly, after two rewarding years in the role, Rachel is handing the reins over to the new generation of student representatives, and she thanks all the faculty and students for making the past couple of years so great!
- Monisha Sharma, ScM, PhD, Assistant Professor of Global Health has worked with several CHOICE students on a Gates-funded project to model the impact of PrEP scale up on HIV drug resistance in sub-Saharan Africa. The project results were cited in the recently released WHO technical brief.

- Assistant Professor Jing Li's co-first authored publication on <u>Social Determinants of Health and</u> <u>Geographic Variation in Medicare per Beneficiary</u> <u>Spending</u> has been cited in several issues of the <u>Federal Register by the Centers for Medicare and</u> <u>Medicaid Services</u>. Two of Dr. Li's ongoing work, one on dementia and wealth, and the other on advance care planning and end-of-life care, were presented at the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) Summer Institute 2022 Aging Meeting.
- Professor Andy Stergachis and fifth year PhD student Sabra Zaraa are collaborators for the newly released living systematic review and metaanalysis of COVID-19 vaccines for pregnant persons, covering vaccine safety, efficacy, effectiveness, and immunogenicity. This project,

supported by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, is a collaboration between Tulane University, the Institute for Clinical Effectiveness & Health Policy (ICES, Buenos Aires, Argentina), London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, World Health Organization, and the University of Washington. - In the field of machine learning, Blythe Adamson, MPH, PhD '18 coauthored a new Report from the ISPOR Task Force on Machine Learning Methods in HEOR and published in Nature Digital Medicine the Flatiron Health prospective validation of a clinical decision tool powered by ML and deployed at cancer clinics across the country. The New York Times and other press featured Adamson and her company, Infectious Economics, in the guidance of COVID vaccination policies and cost-effective testing deployed for private businesses including Broadway theaters and retail stores across the country. - Nathorn (Nui) Chaiyakunapruk, PharmD, PhD '01, and his research team have investigated

situation of snakebite problems and antivenom access in Southeast Asia in ASEAN countries. They found that a number of reasons contributing to the problem including antivenom availability and affordability, procurement and supply chain, treatment seeking behavior, lack of snakebiterelated informatics system, and health system and policy. They also estimated the economic burden and projected the potential implications of improving access to snake antivenom. These works were supported by Wellcome Trust. They were published in BMJ Glob Health and Plos Negl Trop Disease.

 Jonathan Watanabe, PharmD, PhD, '98, '08, '12, was appointed to the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy-sponsored Committee Methadone Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder: Improving Access Through Regulatory Change by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine.
