Activities and Accomplishments

Faculty News:

Dr. Jenny Bacci received funding from the UW Center for Health Workforce Studies to investigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on community pharmacist patient care and future workforce needs. [Read more about the study.](#)

Dr. David Veenstra is working with **Dr. Beth Devine** in CHOICE and Dr. Sarah Knerr in the Department of Health Systems and Population Health to design the outcomes assessment for a study (eMERGE 4) in 25,000 patients of the role of Polygenic Risk Scores to inform disease prevention strategies. **Dr. Veenstra, Dr. Greg Guzauaskas, Scott Spencer, and Joyce Jiang** also recently completed an evaluation of the cost effectiveness of population-level screening for the three CDC Tier 1 genomic applications, in collaboration with Geisinger Healthcare System and Vanderbilt University. Dr. Veenstra also helped establish a new elective course, 'Opportunities in Industry for Pharmacists,' in collaboration with Josh Gener, PharmD.

Dr. Douglas Barthold presented his research on the possible connection between healthcare value and cognitive impairment at the Program on Regulation, Therapeutics, and Law (PORTAL) Seminar at Harvard Medical School. He also recently published two first author publications: "[Alzheimer's disease related neuropathology among patients with](#)

medication treated type 2 diabetes in a community-based autopsy cohort" in the Journal of Alzheimer's Disease, and "Minimum threshold of bariatric surgical weight loss for diabetes remission" in Diabetes Care.

Dr. Andy Stergachis served on the National Academy of Medicine committee that issued its Consensus Study Report on October 20, 2021, Combating Antimicrobial Resistance and Protecting the Miracle of Modern Medicine. [Download a free PDF of the report.](#)

Dr. Stergachis was also appointed as a Washington State Pharmacy Association Fellow in recognition of his dedication in promoting public health roles of pharmacists, including in public health preparedness & response.

She is also happy to be working with Dr. Ruth Etzioni from Fred Hutch on a project that involves a new imaging technique for screening prostate cancer, and she is looking forward for her RAship with Dr. Anirban Basu on the state's effort to eliminate Hepatitis C.

1st year PhD student, **Felipe Montano-Campos**, co-authored the paper "Factors Influential in the Selection of Radiology Residents in the Post-Step1 World: A Discrete Choice Experiment" published by the Journal of the American College of Radiology. This paper received special mention by the Editor in Chief of the Journal and was mentioned in the media/blogs/news. Reporting of United States Medical Licensing Examination Step 1 results will transition from a numerical score to a pass/fail result. The study analyzes how the preference weights are redistributed among the different attributes of the applicants when the Step-1 score is binary. They found that this change has unintended consequences: Benefits continue to accrue to medical school privilege and step 2 scores gain more importance. [Read more in the full article.](#)
