Associate Professor **Jennifer Bacci** and Affiliate Assistant Professor **Parth Shah** received a University of Washington School of Pharmacy Faculty Innovation Fund grant for their study, "Does community pharmacy-based pediatric vaccinations result in missed well-child visits?"

We are happy to announce that 2 publications made it among JMCPs most cited for 2022. One article, "Use of realworld evidence in economic assessments of pharmaceuticals in the United States" (first author **Woojung Lee**), was part of the CHOICE health tech fund initiative sponsored by our Corporate Advisory Board. The second, "Cost-effectiveness of oral semaglutide added to current antihyperglycemic treatment for type 2 diabetes" (first author **Greg Guzauskas**), was the result of work on our contract with the Institute for Clinical and Economic Review (ICER). <u>Read more.</u>

Congratulations to our newest CHOICE alum, **Samantha Clark**, **PhD**. Samantha defended her doctoral dissertation in December, titled "Investigating the effect of Gleevec list price on adherence and outcomes in Medicare patients with chronic myeloid leukemia". Samantha has joined the consulting company, Medicus Economics, as a Senior Associate.

PhD student **Rachel Wittenauer** had the opportunity to testify in Olympia, WA at the Washington State Legislature in both the House (Dec. '22) and Senate (Feb. '23) Health Care committees regarding her research on pharmacy access in Washington as it relates to several ongoing legislative efforts, in collaboration with members of the Washington State Pharmacy Association and CHOICE faculty **Dr. Jennifer Bacci.** "As a researcher it was incredibly rewarding to share results in a forum with power to enact real policy change, and was a fantastic learning experience. If we can prevent closures of pharmacies we can slow or even reverse the disparity in access to these vital services," Wittenauer said. <u>Read more.</u>

A paper co-authored by CHOICE Research Scientist **Greg Guzauskas**, PhD student **Joyce Jiang**, and Professor **Dave Veenstra**, funded by an NIH grant in collaboration with Vanderbilt and Geisinger received the following award: Top 10 key advances of 2022 in applying genomic information to clinical care, selected by the Genomic Medicine Working Group of the National Advisory Council for Human Genome Research (NHGRI). This paper examined the value of population Lynch Syndrome screening to prevent colorectal cancer compared to the standard of care (i.e., family history-based screening). Using decision analytic modeling, we found that population LS screening may be costeffective in younger patient populations under a \$150,000 willingness-to-pay per QALY threshold and with a relatively inexpensive test cost. Further reductions in testing costs and/or the inclusion of LS testing within a broader multiplex screening panel are needed for screening to become highly cost-effective. Read the article. PhD student **Felipe Montano-Campos** published a paper in MDM Policy & Practice. He and his colleagues studied how conventional MARs could lead decision makers to accept a treatment based on individual risks that would not be acceptable if multiple risks are considered simultaneously. <u>Read the article.</u>

As UW site-PI of the AHRQ-funded Pacific Northwest Evidence-based Practice Center, Professor **Beth Devine** recently served as a member of the methods group that updated the 2010 AHRQ Methods Guide for Comparative Effectiveness Reviews that provides guidance for the inclusion of nonrandomized studies of intervention effectiveness in systematic reviews. Together, **Dr. Devine** and **Dr. Noah Hammarland** championed inclusion of the section on causal inference methods. A summary of the AHRQ Report was published in the Journal of Clinical Epidemiology, accompanied by an Editor´s Choice designation with companion commentaries by the Cochrane Collaboration, the Campbell Collaboration, and the GRADE Working Group. <u>Read more.</u>

Affiliate Assistant Professor **Kai Yeung ('15)** was selected to serve on the Washington State Healthcare Authority's Finance Technical Advisory Committee to advise on the State's development of a Universal Healthcare coverage program. Dr. Yeung also joined Amazon in September as a Senior Healthcare Research Scientist.
